About Tonight's Musicians

American violinist Emmanuel Borowsky has toured 37 countries in North America, Europe, Asia, and the Middle East and has performed as soloist with orchestras around the globe. Emmanuel's love of music is manifested in his educational work with aspiring musicians. He is a professor at Dickinson College and each summer teaches violin and chamber music at the esteemed Internuse International Music Institute and Festival USA. Emmanuel teaches privately in Baltimore and is a frequent adjudicator of competitions and festivals.

Cellist Frances Borowsky hails from Baltimore, MD. She has performed in over thirty countries throughout Europe, Asia, North America, and the Middle East, including as soloist with orchestras in China, Lithuania, Poland, and the USA. Frances made her New York debut at Carnegie Hall at the age of twelve. Since 2020, she has served as Co-Executive Director of the Intermuse Music Institute and Festival in Maryland, a summer chamber music program for high school and college students. She has served on the faculty of Lebanon Valley College, Elizabethtown College, and the Community College of Baltimore County, and teaches privately in Baltimore.
